The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum is pleased to announce the 2014 Arthur and Rochelle Belfer National Conference for Educators: English Language Arts. The conference is funded by a grant from the Belfer Foundation.

Middle and high school educators and community college faculty are encouraged to attend. The conference is designed for educators with less than five years’ experience teaching about the Holocaust, but educators with more experience may attend. (Educators with five or more years’ experience teaching about the Holocaust may apply to the Museum Teacher Fellowship Program; an online application is available at www.ushmm.org/educators/professional-events-and-resources/museum-teacher-fellowship-program.)

During the conference, museum educators and scholars will share rationales, strategies, and approaches for presenting the complex subject of the Holocaust to students.

Participants will hear survivor testimony and have extensive time to view the Museum’s Permanent Exhibition; *Some Were Neighbors: Collaboration and Complicity in the Holocaust*; *Remember the*

Children: Daniel’s Story; *From Memory to Action: Meeting the Challenge of Genocide*; and other special exhibitions.

Seminar sessions will emphasize planning and implementing units of study for Holocaust education. Teachers who complete the program receive a set of educational Holocaust-related resources from the Museum shop.
