The conference is designed for educators with less than five years’ experience teaching about the Holocaust, but educators with more experience are also invited to attend.

By attending the conference, you will

- Work closely with Museum staff, historians, and expert educators
- Have exclusive access to Museum exhibitions when the Museum is closed to the public
- Obtain lesson plans that focus on propaganda, teaching diverse audiences, and the relevance of the Holocaust today
- Learn about opportunities to become teacher leaders in Holocaust education
- Network with educators from around the country

- Hear firsthand testimony of a Holocaust survivor
- Receive free books and other materials, plus a gift card of \$100 to be used in the Museum Shop

Lunch will be provided for two of the three days, and an evening reception will be held on the second day.
